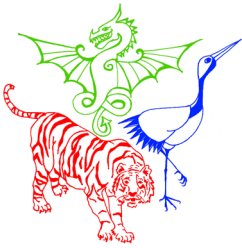

# S.T.O.R.M. AND ASSISTANT INSTRUCTOR LEVELS

Level	Title	Requirements
One	<b>S.T.O.R.M. Trainee</b>	Status given to all new members. All must be of hard working attitude and willing to learn. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Level Everyone Starts off in</li><li>• No Experience needed</li><li>• One Training Seminar</li><li>• Minimum Rank: Sankyu</li></ul>
		
Two	<b>Junior S.T.O.R.M.</b>	Status received by all members after initial training course and after member has assisted in a minimum of twelve classes. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 15 Classes assisted</li><li>• Two training Seminars</li><li>• Rank Minimum: Sankyu</li></ul>
		
Three	<b>Senior S.T.O.R.M.</b>	Status received by all members after participating as a Junior S.T.O.R.M. member for one year. Senior members typically run exercises and stretching in front of a class. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 50 Classes assisted</li><li>• Four Training Seminars</li><li>• Rank Minimum: Ikkyu</li><li>• Open Book Test (Basic H&amp;T, S.T.O.R.M. principles)</li></ul>
		
Four	<b>Assistant Instructor (Lower Level)</b>	Status received by all members after being a Senior S.T.O.R.M. member for one year. Among other things, Assistant Instructors work with students one-on-one and in small groups. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 75 Classes assisted</li><li>• Six Training Seminars</li><li>• Rank Minimum: Ikkyu</li><li>• Closed Book Test (Basic H&amp;T, S.T.O.R.M. principles)</li></ul>
		
Five	<b>Assistant Instructor (Upper Level)</b>	Status received by all members after being an Assistant Instructor for one year. The duties of a Assistant Instructor-Upper Level include running the first ten minutes of a class. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 100 Classes assisted</li><li>• Eight Training Seminars</li><li>• Rank Minimum: Jr Black Belt (Level One) or Shodan</li><li>• Open Book Test (Detailed H&amp;T, A.I. principles)</li></ul>
		



# INSTRUCTOR LEVELS

Level	Title	Requirements
Six	<b>Instructor Apprentice</b>	Status given to Assistant Instructors who show potential to lead their own class. Instructor-Apprentices work under the guidance of a Chief Instructor for at least six months. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 200 Classes Assisted</li><li>• Ten Training Seminars</li><li>• Minimum Rank: Jr. Black Belt (Level Two) or Nidan</li><li>• Panel Inquiry</li><li>• Closed Book Test</li></ul>
Seven	<b>Full Instructor</b>	Status given to Instructors when assigned to a class or a specific task. (i.e. running kyu tests, or small classes). <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 300 Classes Assisted (Including special events)</li><li>• Twelve Training Seminars</li><li>• Minimum Rank: Jr. Black Belt (Level Three) or Sandan</li><li>• Closed Book Test</li><li>• Panel Inquiry</li></ul>
Eight	<b>Chief Instructor</b>	<p><b>Status given to Instructors when assigned to a class.</b></p> <p><b>Chief Instructors are excellent in all areas of teaching.</b></p>
Nine	<b>Head Instructor</b>	<p><b>Status given to the Senior Instructor of a dojo, usually the sempai.</b></p> <p><b>Duty is to the development of all the students of the dojo.</b></p>
Ten	<b>Head Master</b>	<p><b>The Sensei of a dojo.</b></p> <p><b>Duty is to the promotion of the students and the continuance of the tradition of the style.</b></p>
